**REGULATIONS & COURSES OF STUDIES
FOR 2 YEARS POST BASIC BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (NURSING) COURSE – 2023**

1. **Title and commencement of the Program:**
 - (a) These regulations may be called "The Post Basic Bachelor of Science in Nursing)" [In short Post Basic B. Sc (Nursing)] Regulations- 2023".
 - (b) These regulations and courses of studies (syllabus) are in conformity with the Indian Nursing Council (In short INC).
 - (c) They shall come into force from the current academic year 2023-24.
 - (d) The Regulations and courses of studies prescribed are subject to modification by the Academic Council and Executive Board of the Odisha University of Health Sciences, Bhubaneswar from time to time.

2. **Introduction:** Nursing in the 21st century is like a cord that binds a patient's health care experience together. Nursing as a profession and a discipline utilizes knowledge derived from arts, sciences (physical, biological and behavioral), humanities and human experience. Nursing science incorporates clinical competence, critical thinking, communication, teaching learning, professionalism, and caring and cultural competency. Nurses collaborate with other health disciplines to solve individual and community health problems. Nursing facilitates evidence-based practice, compassionate caring among its practitioners in response to emerging issues in healthcare and new discoveries and technologies in profession.

Nursing contributes to the health services in a vital and significant way in the health care delivery system. It recognizes national health goals and is committed to participate in the implementation of National Health Policies and programmes. It aims at identifying health needs of the people, planning and providing quality care in collaboration with other health professional and community groups.

The teachers have the responsibility to be role models and create learning environment that enables students to acquire inquiry driven, self-directed learning and foster an attitude of life long learning.

Under graduate nursing education program at post basic level prepares its graduates to become exemplary citizen by adhering to code of ethics and professional conduct at all times in fulfilling personal, social and professional obligations so as to respond to national aspirations.

3. **Goal:** To impart quality education that not only enhances the students' theoretical knowledge base but also their competency & skill-based care.

4. **Objective:** On completion of the Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing program, the B.Sc. nursing graduates will be able to;
 - a) Assess health status, identify nursing needs, plan, implement and evaluate nursing care for patients/clients that contribute to health of individuals, families and communities.
 - b) Demonstrate competency in techniques of nursing based on concepts and principles from selected areas of nursing, physical, biological and behavioral sciences.
 - c) Participate as members of health team in the promotive, preventive, curative and restorative health care delivery system of the country.
 - d) Demonstrate skills in communication and interpersonal relationship.
 - e) Demonstrate leadership qualities and decision-making abilities in various situations.
 - f) Demonstrate skills in teaching to individuals and groups in community health settings.

- g) Demonstrate managerial skills in community health settings.
- h) Practice ethical values in their personal and professional life.
- i) Participate in research activities and utilize research findings in improving nursing practice.
- j) Recognize-the need for continued learning for their personal and professional development.

5. **Eligibility for admission to the Course:** The eligibility criteria prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council i.e GNM Diploma holders from time to time for admission to the course shall be applicable to the affiliated colleges / institutions under the University mutatis mutandis. In addition, candidate (s) allotted a seat on the basis of qualifying examination and merit, shall be required to submit college leaving certificate, migration certificate (if applicable) in original, physical fitness certificate and a declaration before the Principal / Director of the Institution that

(i) I am not continuing in any Degree Course under any State, Deemed, Central University and Autonomous Body,

(ii) I have not been involved in any kind of criminal and unlawful activities in the past.

Provided further, after fulfilment of all condition (s), the University on receipt of student detail with prescribed fees, shall issue University Registration Number as per OUHS First Statute-2023, which shall be used as Roll Number for Annual Examination (s).

6. **Duration:** The duration of the course shall be two academic years. The candidate for the degree is required to pursue the course on a full-time basis and must complete the course within four years from the year of enrolment.

7. **Medium of instruction:** English shall be the medium of instruction for all the subjects of study and for examination of the course.

8. **Commencement of the Course:** The course will commence from August 1st of every year or as to be prescribed by the University from year to year.

9. **Academic Year:** The academic year shall be twelve months commencing on the first day of enrolment into the course.

10. **Attendance:** A candidate is required to put in a minimum of 80% in theory and 100% in practical separately in each subject to appear in the university examination.

11. **Course Cycle and Structure:** The Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing program is a two-year program carrying 1950 marks including qualifying and college level examinations. The 2 years course cycle and programme structure is prescribed hereunder Table No 02.

11.1. The codes used in this Regulations & Courses of Studies.

- i. The total number of digits used in the course is 8 and 9 in case of Practicals.
- ii. The 1st two digits (Numerical) indicates the Year of the Courses of Studies.
- iii. The 3rd digit (Letter) indicates the "Faculty" Nursing Education.
- iv. The 4th & 5th digits (Letters) indicate the Course Code "Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing".
- v. The 6th & 7th digits (Letters) indicate the code for the Subject.
- vi. The 8th digit (Numerical) indicates the sequence of the of the year of the Programme.
- vii. The 9th digit (Numerical / Letter) indicates the sequence number of the subject of a year, or Practical of the Theory Subject.

12. Plan of Studies (Teaching, & Practical):

First Year: A student shall be required to attend 52 weeks works per year including University examinations. There shall be 525 hours theory instruction and 810 hours practical which includes clinical. The structural layout of the program and its courses requires that each course be divided in theory lecture, lab hours and clinical hours. Duration of each lecture will be 1 hour. In some subjects where case study-based methodology is adopted, the lectures are supplemented by discussions on case studies. Similarly, during lab / practical sessions, the students work on prescribed list of procedures which is based on what they have learnt in the Lecture, and the students will be imparted clinical training in a hospital (s) according to the specialized training

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requirements of the students. During first year s/he will be required to Nursing Foundation, Nutrition and Dietetics, Biochemistry and Biophysics, Psychology, Child Health Nursing, Microbiology, Medical and Surgical Nursing and English.

English as a subject of study shall be treated as Qualifying Examination with passing mark as 33%. The marks shall not be counted for Class or aggregate. Teaching of Anatomy, Physiology, Pharmacology and Pathology will be integrated with clinical subjects.

Second Year: A student shall be required to attend 395 hours of teaching, and 855 hours of practical and clinical practice in the subjects such as Sociology, Community Health Nursing, Mental Health Nursing, Introduction to Nursing Education, Introduction to Nursing Administration, Introduction to Nursing Research and Statistics, Environmental Science, and undertake a research project.

A student is required to qualify in Introduction to Nursing Research and Statistics, Environmental Science, and research project and to be evaluated at the college / institution level.

13. Scheme of Internal Assessments:

13.1. Internal assessment will be done in each subject of study and the marks will be awarded to the candidates as detailed in the scheme of examinations.

13.2. The marks awarded will be based on the basis of candidate's performance in the assignments, class tests, laboratory work, clinical training, preparation and presentation of the seminars as assessed by the teachers

13.3. A checklist or criteria to be developed by the respective institutions for objective evaluation of assignments, records, reports, and clinical presentations.

13.4. The candidate appearing for back or supplementary examination in the subject will have the same internal marks secured in the previous examination (1st attempt).

13.5. The internal marks to be calculated based on the following criteria.

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14. Eligibility criterions for appearing University Examinations:

14.1. A student is required fulfill the following to be eligible for appearing Annual University Examinations;

- (i) Attended 80 % theory and 100% practical classes,
- (ii) Passed the Internal Assessments of the Academic Year,
- (iii) The candidate shall have cleared minimum four University Theory Examinations excluding qualifying subject of first year annual examinations to be eligible for appearing at second year annual examination. However, the candidates shall be permitted to attend the consecutive year theory and practical sessions/ hours of instructions.
- (iv) The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 4 years.

15. Examinations: The University shall conduct examination for prescribed University theory and practical subjects at the end of an year.

15.1. Combination and distribution of component wise marks:

- a) University examination to be conducted after the completion of Eleven months of the course for the annual pattern. The University Examinations will be conducted in the annual pattern for both 2 (two) years.
- b) The particulars of subjects for various examinations and distribution of marks are detailed in the Programme structure.
- c) The examination for the main subjects will be conducted by the University and the marks for the internal subjects will be awarded by the subject handling faculty and forwarded to University by the concerned college / institution.
- d) The University Practical Examinations shall be jointly conducted by one internal and one external examiner duly appointed by the University.
- e) To be an examiner the faculty should possess three years of experience after M.Sc Nursing.
- f) If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and practical).
- g) All practical examinations must be held in the respective clinical areas.
- h) Maximum number of candidates for Practical examination should not exceed more than 20 students per day
- i) The external practical examination should have the following criteria and weightage:

- j) Students shall be permitted to use Simple calculator during Nursing Research & Statistics examination.
- k) A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in both internal and external examination of each paper.
- l) A candidate has to secure minimum of 50% of marks in the University Theory and practical Examinations separately excluding English, Environmental Science
- m) Minimum pass mark for English shall be 33% only.
- n) If a candidate who has failed to secure the minimum pass mark of 50% either in theory or practical has to reappear for both the papers. (Theory and practical).

15.2. Scheme of Theory Examinations [University & End Year Theory & Practical / Clinical Subject (s)]:

15.3. Uniform Formats / Templates: The University, therefore, has prescribed following uniform format (s) to be followed at the college / institution level, and university end for all purposes under **Annexure A (Series)**.

15.4. Preservation of Evidences: The answer scripts of the class test or other records of internal assessment shall, however, be preserved in the department as a part of record (Electronic / Hard Copy) for the whole tenure of 04 years of the Course and shall be subject to scrutiny at the time of verification. After that period, the scripts may be disposed off or send for recycling as per rules of the University.

16. Registration for Annual Examinations:

(i) The College / Institution shall register the subjects of eligible students with the University on payment of a fee as to be notified by the University towards conduct of Annual (Regular / Back) examinations. The College / Institution shall retain 15% of the University fees towards Examination Centres expenditure. However, such retention of fees @ 15% shall not be applicable in case of Supplementary / Back Paper Examinations.

(ii) The College / Institution shall follow uniform Question pattern / template / Answer Booklets and Records for conducting continuous Internal (Theory and Practical / Clinical Assessments).

17. Passing Heads: The passing percentage in respect of both theory and practicals is in conformity with the guidelines prescribed by Indian Nursing Council.

17.1. Passing percentage of Theory / Practical Marks:

(i) Passing head for core theory and Practical shall be 50%. Core theory consists of (i) Theory 75 Marks, and (ii) Internal Assessment 25 Marks, 35 marks and 15 marks and 38-37 marks (A & B) and 25 marks.

(ii) A candidate is required to secure 50% marks out of 100 Marks separately ie. Theory and Practical. Similarly, a candidate shall be required to secure 50% marks out of the attached Practical component carrying 50 Marks.

(iii) Further, in the event, a candidate failed in either theory, or practical, it shall be treated as "Fail" in the whole core theory and attached Practical subject, and s/he shall be required to re-appear both theory and practical as back paper (s).

18. Promotion, Carry over benefit and Re-admission:

(i) The candidate shall register, and appear college level and University theory and prescribed practical examinations, and have cleared minimum four numbers of theory examinations excluding qualifying examinations. However, if the candidate, the candidates shall be permitted to attend the second / final year.

(ii) The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 4 years.

(iii) Candidates having a break of study of 1 year and above or more than two spells of break will be considered for re-admission.

(iv) The calculation of the break of study of the candidate for re-admission shall be calculated from the date of first discontinuance of the course.

(v) Candidate having break of study shall be considered for re-admission provided that they are not subjected to any disciplinary action and no charges are pending or contemplated against them.

19. Supplementary Examination: There will be a supplementary examination for second / final year theory subjects within three months from the date of publication of final year examination to extend a chance to clear the failed subjects of second year only. However, a candidate shall not be eligible; if s/he has not registered for the Second Year University Examinations, and accordingly have not been eligible to appear the University Theory and Practical Examinations.

20. Classification of successful candidates and award of Degree: The University will follow the absolute pattern with Class and shall award Degrees to the successful candidates in prescribed examinations in all subjects after fulfilment of 100% of hours notified in each of the practical areas before course completion.

20.1. Declaration of Pass:

- (i) First Class with Distinction – 75% marks and above
- (ii) First Class – 60% marks and less than 74.99% marks
- (iii) Second Class – 50% marks and less than 59.99%

20.2. Mark sheet: Mark sheet will be issued only after passing in the prescribed subjects including qualifying, college level and Practicals of an academic year.

21. Log Book, Record and Evaluation Guidelines: The Log Book, Record, and guidelines as prescribed in the Indian Nursing Council, vis a vis University shall be strictly followed mutatis mutandis by the Examiners when assessing a theory and practical component etc.

22. Withdrawal from Course, Struck off from the rolls of the College / Institution Admitted and withdrawal of Degree:

22.1. The University upon application, shall cancel the registration number issued to the candidate, and issue migration certificate on payment of fee to be prescribed by the University.

22.2. A student's name will be struck off from the rolls of the College / Institution in any of the following cases if he/ she does not qualify / pass within the permitted tenure of the Course.

22.3 A student without intimation remained absent for more than one year.

22.4. Any student found to have obtained admission in fraudulent manner, if the documents furnished for gaining admission by any student are found to be forged / false / doctored at any stage of study.

22.5. If any student is found to be involved in serious breach of discipline.

22.6 A degree awarded by the University may be withdrawn; if it is found at the later stage that the candidate has submitted any forged document or ineligible at the time of admission to the course.

23. Medal (s), Award (s) & Prize (s): The University shall notify as and when decided by the Executive Board from time to time.

24. Discretionary Power: Notwithstanding anything contained in the above, in case of any doubt or difficulty as to the interpretation of these Regulation (s), the matter shall be referred to the Vice Chancellor and his / her decision in this behalf, subject to the provisions of the OUHS Act - 2021, and 1st Statute - 2023 shall be final.
