**REGULATIONS & COURSES OF STUDIES
FOR 2 YEARS MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING DEGREE – 2023**

1. Title and commencement of the Program:

- (i) These regulations may be called "The Master of Science in Nursing)" [In short M.Sc. (Nursing)] Regulations- 2023".
- (ii) These regulations and courses of studies (syllabus) are in conformity with the Indian Nursing Council (In short INC).
- (iii) They shall come into force from the current academic year 2023-24.
- (iv) The Regulations and courses of studies prescribed are subject to modification by the Academic Council and Executive Board of the Odisha University of Health Sciences, Bhubaneswar from time to time.

2. Introduction: National Health Policy (NHP) 2017 recognises the need to improve regulation and quality management of nursing education. Developing specialized nursing training courses and curriculum (critical care, cardio-thoracic vascular care, neurological care, trauma care, palliative care and care of terminally ill), establishing nursing school in every large district or cluster of districts of about 20 to 30 lakh population and establishing Centers of Excellence for Nursing and Allied Health Sciences. The policy also recognizes that human resource management is critical to health system strengthening and healthcare delivery and therefore the policy supports measures aimed at continuing medical and nursing education and on the job support to providers, especially those working in professional isolation in rural areas using digital tools and other appropriate training resources. Indian Nursing Council believes that: Postgraduate programme is essential to prepare nurses to improve the quality of nursing education and practice in India.

Postgraduate programme in nursing builds upon and extends competence acquired at the graduate levels, emphasizes application of relevant theories into nursing practice, education, administration and development of research skills. Scientific and technological advancements have also created complexity in the field of nursing necessitating advanced educational preparations. To keep pace with the tremendous progress in medical science and to meet changing health care needs specialization and research are essential in nursing science.

This M.Sc. Nursing Course has been designed to assist students in developing expertise and in-depth understanding in the field of nursing education, Medical-Surgical Nursing, Obstetrics & Gynaecological Nursing, Paediatric Nursing, Community Health Nursing, Nursing Management, Advance Nursing Practices, Nursing Education, Nursing Administration, Mental Health & Psychiatric Nursing, Nursing Research & Statistics. It will further enable the student to function as a professional nurse, clinical specialty nurse, and educator, administrator, manager, nursing leader supervisor, evaluator, and researcher. It will further enable the students to evaluate research studies and utilize research findings to improve the quality of nursing practice, education, management, and administration. It would provide an opportunity to PG students to understand, appreciate and acquire skills in teaching and evaluation, curricular development, implementation, maintenance of standards and accreditation of various nursing education programs to compete with the new challenges and globalization.

This programme prepares nursing graduates who are professionally equipped to deal with day-to-day problems within the existing constraints and thus act as an agent of social change.

3. Goal: The goal of the postgraduate program in nursing is to prepare graduates to assume responsibilities as nurse specialists, consultants, educators, administrators in a wide variety of professional settings.

4. **Objective:** On Completion of the two year M.Sc Nursing programme, the graduate will be able to:- Utilize/apply the concepts, theories and principles of nursing science
- (i) Demonstrate advance competence in practice of nursing
 - (ii) Practice as a nurse specialist.
 - (iii) Demonstrate leadership qualities and function effectively as nurse educator and manager.
 - (iv) Demonstrate skill in conducting nursing research, interpreting and utilizing the findings from health-related research.

5. **Eligibility for admission to the Course:** The eligibility criteria prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council from time to time for admission to the course shall be applicable to the affiliated colleges / institutions under the University mutatis mutandis. In addition, candidate (s) allotted a seat on the basis of qualifying examination and merit, shall be required to submit college leaving certificate, migration certificate (if applicable) in original, physical fitness certificate and a declaration before the Principal / Director of the College / Institution that

- (i) I am not continuing in any Degree Course under any State, Deemed, Central University and Autonomous Body,
- (ii) I have not been involved in any kind of criminal and unlawful activities in the past.

Provided further, after fulfilment of all condition (s), the University on receipt of student detail with prescribed fees, shall issue University Registration Number as per OUHS First Statute-2023, which shall be used as Roll Number for Annual Examination (s).

6. **Duration:** The duration of the course shall be two academic years. The candidate for the degree is required to pursue the course on a full-time basis and must complete the course within four years from the year of enrolment.
7. **Medium of instruction:** English shall be the medium of instruction for all the subjects of study and for examination of the course.
8. **Commencement of the Course:** The course will commence from August 1st of every year or as to be prescribed by the University from year to year.
9. **Academic Year:** The academic year shall be twelve months commencing on the first day of enrolment into the course.
10. **Attendance:** A candidate is required to put in a minimum of 75% of attendance in theory and 100% in practical separately and should have completed all the requirements prescribed for each program of study including clinical practice before admission to examinations.
11. **Course Cycle and Structure:** The M.Sc. Nursing program is a two-year program carrying 1300 marks including qualifying and college level examinations. The 2 years course cycle and programme structure is prescribed hereunder Table No 01.

11.1. The codes used in this Regulations & Courses of Studies.

- i. The total number of digits used in the course is 8 and 9 in case of Practicals.
- ii. The 1st two digits (Numerical) indicates the Year of the Courses of Studies.
- iii. The 3rd digit (Letter) indicates the "Faculty" Nursing Education.
- iv. The 4th & 5th digits (Letters) indicate the Course Code "M.Sc. Nursing".
- v. The 6th & 7th digits (Letters) indicate the code for the Subject.
- vi. The 8th digit (Numerical / Letter) indicates the sequence of the of the year or Speciality of the Programme.

- vii. The 9th digit (Numerical / Letter) indicates the sequence number of the subject of a year, or Speciality Practical of the Theory Subject.

12. Plan of Studies (Teaching, & Practical): The plan of Teaching and practice for the two years M.Sc in Nursing Programme is as under.

12.1 First Year: A student shall be required to attend 43 weeks works per year including University examinations. There shall be 600 hours theory instruction and 1100 hours practical which includes clinical. The structural layout of the program and its courses requires that each course be divided in theory lecture, lab hours and clinical hours. The methods of teaching include lecture cum discussion, demonstration / return demonstration, seminar / presentation, project work, field visits,

and workshop. Duration of each lecture will be 1 hour. In some subjects where case study-based methodology is adopted, the lectures are supplemented by discussions on case studies. Similarly, during lab / practical sessions, the students work on prescribed list of procedures which is based on what they have learnt in the Lecture, and the students will be imparted clinical training in a hospital (s) according to the specialized training requirements of the students.

During first year s/he will be required to study Nursing Education, Advance Nursing Practice, Nursing Research & Statistics, and one clinical speciality from amongst the five. The student has to maintain log book for each activity during the course of study. In addition, a student will also be required to prepare a research proposal and shall submit during the 9th month of the course period.

The Postgraduate students shall attend conferences, workshops, seminars and do publication / presentation of papers during their study period.

12.2 Second Year: A student shall be required to attend 300 hours of teaching, and 1400 hours of practical and clinical practice in the subjects such as Nursing Management, one clinical speciality to be selected other than the one opted in the first year and submit the Dissertation Project during the 9th month of the course period. S/he shall undertake and complete the dissertation report under the Research Guide. Main guide shall be from amongst the Nursing faculty / nursing expert in the same clinical speciality holding Ph.D./ M.Phil / M.Sc. Nursing with a minimum of 3 years' experience in teaching in the Postgraduate Programme in Nursing. A Co-Guide is a nursing faculty/expert in the field of study (may be from outside the college but should be within the city.)

The Postgraduate students shall attend conferences, workshops, seminars and do publication / presentation of papers during their study period.

No candidate shall be permitted to any one of the parts of M.Sc. Degree course in Nursing unless he/she has attended the course in the subject for the prescribed period in an affiliated institution recognized by this University and produces the necessary certificate of study, attendance and progress from the Head of the Institution.

13. Scheme of Internal Assessments: The method of evaluation shall include tests, presentations, project work and written assignments.

13.1. There shall be an internal assessment in all the subjects, and marks for each subject will be according the weightage given to each subject. A minimum of three written examinations shall be conducted in each subject during a year. The written examination preceding the University examination shall be similar to the pattern of University examination. The average marks of the three performances shall be taken into consideration for the award of internal assessment marks.

13.2. A minimum of one practical examination shall be conducted in each subject (wherever practical have been included in the prescribed structure / curriculum) and grades of ongoing clinical evaluation to be considered for the award of internal assessment marks.

13.3 The college examinations along with marks of all evaluation will form the final grade for the Internal Assessment for the subjects. These marks required to be submitted to the University three weeks before commencement to the University Examinations and mandatory.

13.4. Any candidate who fails in the Internal Assessment would be given an opportunity to improve the Internal Assessment. A candidate shall secure 50% marks in theory / practical separately in each subject / practical to be eligible to appear for the University examinations. However, s/he shall not be allowed, if s/he lack in prescribed minimum percentage of attendance in both theory and practical hours.

13.5. The candidate appearing for back or supplementary examination in the subject will have the same internal marks secured in the previous examination (1st attempt).

13.6. The internal marks to be calculated based on the following criteria.

a) Internal Assessment for theory (Common to all): (50 Marks)

Weightage for Internal Assessment

- (i) Theory Term Test: 30 % Weightage
- (ii) Assignment: 10 % Weightage
- (iii) Seminar presentation / Journal Club: 10 % Weightage

b) Practical Examination (Common to all speciality subject):

Weightage for Internal Assessment:

- (i) Model Practical Examination including Viva-Voce: 50 % weightage
- (ii) Clinical Assignment (Case Study / Practical Record / Case Book): 10% weightage
- (iii) Clinical Presentation: 10 % weightage
- (iv) Observational / Field Visit / health talk- 10 % weightage
- (v) Continuous evaluation of Clinical Performance-20 % weightage

c) External Practical Examination (Common to all specialty subject): to conduct practical examination as per the given criteria & Weightage

14. **Eligibility criteria for appearing Annual University Examinations:** A student is required fulfill the following to be eligible for appearing Annual University Examinations;

- (i) Attended minimum 80 % classes in theory subject (s) and practical areas / classes,
- (ii) Passed the Internal Assessments of the Academic Year,
- (iii) The candidate has cleared all subjects of 1st year University Theory Examinations to be eligible for appearing at second year annual university examination.
- (iv) The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 4 years.

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15. Examinations: The University shall conduct examination for prescribed University theory and practical subjects as under;

15.1. The University examination shall be conducted after the completion of Eleven months of the course for both 2 (two) years. Minimum pass marks shall be 50 % in each of the Theory and practical papers separately.

15.2. The examination for the main subjects will be conducted by the University and the marks for the internal subjects will be awarded by the subject handling faculty and forwarded to the University by the concerned college / institution. The particulars of subjects for various examinations and distribution of marks are detailed in the Programme structure.

15.3. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper, he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and practical). All practical examinations must be held in the respective clinical areas.

15.4. Maximum no. of attempts permitted for each paper is 3 (three) including first attempt and within the maximum period 4 (four) year to complete the course successfully

15.5. Maximum number of candidates for all practical examination should not exceed 10 (twenty) per day and all practical examinations shall be conducted in the respective clinical areas.

15.6. The Practical University Examinations shall be jointly conducted by one internal and one external examiner (Preferably outside the University) duly appointed by the University. The proforma for assessment of Practical Examinations is attached under Annexure- 2 series.

15.7 An examiner should be M.Sc (N) in concerned subject and have minimum of 3 (three) years postgraduate teaching experience.

15.8 Each College / Institution shall constitute a Research Committee comprising of minimum 5 members under the chairmanship of Principal. The Committee shall approve the synopsis / research proposal of the student (s) in the first year, allot main, co-guide (at students' requirement) and review quarterly till the submission and evaluation of the dissertation. The Guide shall ensure that the title allotted to the student to carry out his / her dissertation work has not been undertaken in the college / institution during last three years. The proforma for evaluation of dissertation is attached under Annexure-2 series.

15.9 One internal and One external examiner (outside the University) should evaluate dissertation and jointly conduct viva-voce for each student

15.10 For Dissertation Internal examiner should be the guide and external examiner should be Nursing faculty / nursing expert in the same clinical speciality holding Ph.D./M.Phil / M.Sc. Nursing with a minimum of 3 years' experience in guiding the research projects for Postgraduate students of Nursing.

15.11. Scheme of Theory Examinations [University & End Year Theory & Practical / Clinical Subject (s)]:

Theory: The distribution of the theory marks for the university examination is: 75 Marks

(i) Types of Question and distribution of marks (common for all subjects):

(a) Long Essays: 4 x 10 marks = 40 marks

(b) Short notes: 7 x 5 marks = 35 marks

(ii) Type of Question and distribution of marks for Nursing Research & Statistics

Section- A: (a) Long Essays: 3 x 10 marks = 30 marks
(b) Short notes: 4 x 5 marks = 20 marks

Section- B: (a) Long Essays: 1 x 10 marks = 10 marks
(b) Short notes: 3 x 5 marks = 15 marks

15.12. Uniform Formats / Templates: The University, therefore, has prescribed following uniform format (s) to be followed at the college / institution level, and university end for all purposes under **Annexure A (Series)**.

15.13. Preservation of Evidences: The answer scripts of the class test or other records of internal assessment including Dissertation shall, however, be preserved in the department as a part of record (Electronic / Hard Copy) for the whole tenure of 04 years of the Course and shall be subject to scrutiny at the time of verification. After that period, the scripts may be disposed off or send for recycling as per rules of the University.

16. Registration for Annual University Examinations:

(i) The College / Institution shall register the subjects of eligible students with the University on payment of a fee as to be notified by the University towards conduct of Annual (Regular / Back / Supplementary) Examinations. The College / Institution shall retain 15% of the University Annual Examination fees towards Examination Centres expenditure. However, such retention of fees @ 15% shall not be applicable in case of Supplementary / Back Paper Examinations.

(ii) The College / Institution shall follow uniform Question pattern / template / Answer Booklets and Records for conducting continuous Internal (Theory and Practical / Clinical Assessments).

17. Passing Heads: The passing percentage in respect of both theory and practicals is in conformity with the guidelines prescribed by Indian Nursing Council.

17.1. Passing percentage of Theory / Practical Marks: A candidate shall be declared to have passed the examination in each subject if he/she secures:

- i. 50% of the marks in the University written examinations,
- ii. 50% of the marks in the University practical examination and
- iii. 50% of marks in the aggregate of the Internal Assessment and University written, practical and oral examinations together,
- iv. 50% of marks in each Section A & B separately where two subjects are combined in single paper. If a candidate who has failed to secure the minimum pass mark of 50% ether in Section A or B, the candidate has to write again both the Sections irrespective the fact whether the candidate has passed in one Section.

18. Promotion, Carry over benefit and Re-admission:

- (a) A Candidate is permitted to carry over a maximum of two subjects to the next academic year. The candidate has to pass the carried over subjects before appearing second year University Examinations.
- (b) A candidate who has failed in more than two subjects shall not be promoted to the second year.
- (c) The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 4 years.
- (d) Candidates having a break of study of 1 year and above or more than two spells of break

- will be considered for re-admission.
- (e) The calculation of the break of study of the candidate for re-admission shall be calculated from the date of first discontinuance of the course.
- (f) Candidate having break of study shall be considered for re-admission provided that they are not subjected to any disciplinary action and no charges are pending or contemplated against them.
19. **Supplementary Examination:** There will be a supplementary examination for the first-year and second year theory subjects within three months from the date of publication of results to extend a chance to clear the failed subjects of those students who have not more than two theory backlogs of the year only. In addition, those candidates shall also not be eligible to appear at the supplementary examination; who neither registered for the Year's University Examinations or registered, and remained absent.
20. **Classification of successful candidates and award of Degree:** The University will follow the absolute marking pattern with Class and shall award M.Sc Degrees in Nursing with Clinical Speciality to the successful candidates in prescribed examinations in all subjects after fulfilment of 100% of hours notified in each of the practical areas before course completion.
- 20.1. **Declaration of Pass:**
- (i) Distinction – 75% marks and above
 - (ii) First Class – 60% marks and less than 74.99% marks
 - (iii) Second Class – 50% marks and less than 59.99%
- 20.2. **Mark sheet:** Mark sheet will be issued only after passing in the prescribed subjects including qualifying, college level and Practicals of an academic year.
21. **Log Book, Record and Evaluation Guidelines:** The Log Book, Record, and guidelines as prescribed in the Indian Nursing Council, vis a vis University shall be strictly followed mutatis mutandis by the Examiners when assessing a theory and practical component etc.
22. **Withdrawal from Course, Struck off from the rolls of the College / Institution Admitted and withdrawal of Degree:**
- 22.1. The University upon application, shall cancel the registration number issued to the candidate, and issue migration certificate on payment of fee to be prescribed by the University.
 - 22.2. A student's name will be struck off from the rolls of the College / Institution in any of the following cases if he/ she does not qualify / pass within the permitted tenure of the Course.
 - 22.3. A student without intimation remained absent for more than one year.
 - 22.4. Any student found to have obtained admission in fraudulent manner, if the documents furnished for gaining admission by any student are found to be forged / false / doctored at any stage of study.
 - 22.5. If any student is found to be involved in serious breach of discipline.
 - 22.6. A degree awarded by the University may be withdrawn; if it is found at the later stage that the candidate has submitted any forged document or ineligible at the time of admission to the course.
23. **Medal (s), Award (s) & Prize (s):** The University shall notify as and when decided by the Executive Board from time to time.

24. **Discretionary Power:** Notwithstanding anything contained in the above, in case of any doubt or difficulty as to the interpretation of these Regulation (s), the matter shall be referred to the Vice Chancellor and his / her decision in this behalf, subject to the provisions of the OUHS Act - 2021, and 1st Statute - 2023 shall be final.
